**From the Desk of Father Rick Schilli**



Tomorrow our nation observes Labor Day. For so many reasons the original intent of some of our holidays and observances has become blurred. The observance originates out of Boston in 1882 as a local celebration of the growing Labor Movement. It became a national holiday in 1894 as a gesture of reconciliation toward organized labor on the part of President Cleveland after workers were killed when clashing with federal agents and military in the course of the Pullman’s strike. Currently it is a more leisurely day that marks the end of summer activities and the heightened momentum of a new school year. Technically, Labor Day does not appear on our Catholic Liturgical calendar. However, the Bishops of the US have encouraged us to look at this day as an opportunity to reflect upon the dignity of human labor. From the work of the Creator Scripture reports to us that God extended his creative power and authority to the human race in many ways. Human labor affords us identity, dignity, creative and artistic expression and the opportunity to inspire one another. Popes from Leo XIII (1891) all the way to Blessed John Paul II and Benedict XVI has on numerous occasions acknowledged the deep connection and bond between the creator and human when we are working to build our world into a place of peace and justice. Our morning Mass, tomorrow Labor Day September 5 will be offered at 9:00 am. I invite you all to join with me in the prayer of the Eucharist that our human labors might be an acceptable offering to God and as we pray for all workers and in particular for those who are unemployed and under-employed.
