From the Desk of Father Rick Schilli

Happy New Year to all! I would like to thank all those who were instrumental in making our liturgies for Christmas and the Feast of the Holy Family so beautiful, servers, ushers, communion ministers, cantors and choir, and a special thanks to those who decorated the church so beautifully.

THE NEW TRANSLATION OF THE ROMAN MISSAL (PART 1)

In less than a year from now, Advent for the Liturgical Year 2012, the Catholics of the English-speaking countries of the world will receive a new translation of the Roman Missal. Already this new has piqued curiosity among some, eagerness and enthusiasm in others, and anxiety and skepticism among others. It has been recommended that during this Liturgical Year some extensive instruction be offered by pastors to the people on the implications and effective this new translation might cause in our parishes.

Beginning today, and continuing for many Sundays during 2011, I will be departing from my usual bulletin column format. When necessary I will include announcements of particular importance and urgency, however, my primary objective this year will be to spend as much time as possible preparing you for the changes we will be implementing next Advent.

The Roman Missal is the altar book used by the priest-celebrant at the celebration of the Eucharist in the Western Catholic Church. These liturgical books find their origins in the 3rd and 4th centuries. Prior to that time, priest and bishops were encouraged to pray extemporaneously and offer prayers they themselves composed for the presider's script. Most scholars agree that no uniform texts were widespread until after the 6th century and each local Church probably had its own unique Missal. After the papacy of Pope Gregory the Great (590-604 AD), local variations began to fade away in favor of a standard form of prayer approved for use by Rome. Latin, of course, was the one and only liturgical language allowed by this time – a principle that would endure until the late 20th century. The Roman Missal has seen many, many revisions over the centuries. Certainly the most extensive until the 20th century was the Missal approved by Pope Pius V by order of the Council of Trent in 1570. Even this Missal continued to be revised from time to time (the most recent was actually during Vatican II by John XXIII and published in 1962).

By order of the bishops at the Second Vatican Council, an even more extensive revision was published by Pope Paul VI in 1970. The most significant changes were the use of a free-standing altar, use of the vernacular language and a revised lectionary of scripture readings for the Mass with the now-familiar three year cycle of readings. In 1970 we began to use the 1970 Roman Missal –first edition in the vernacular (English for us.) In 1975 a second edition was introduced with some changes. Strangely, although these changes were incorporated into the texts of the Mass, a new translation was never made into English.

Ever since the introduction in 1970 of a vernacular language Roman Missal the Vatican has claimed the right of approval of all translated texts. The translations were done by linguists and liturgists and presented to Rome for approval. Many language groups experienced difficulties in providing the best translations possible; this would certainly be true of the English-speaking countries. Criticisms have abounded over the years about how the translations needed to be better.

It may come as a surprise to most Catholic in America that the most recent third edition of the Roman Missal was published by Pope John Paul II in 2000. Unlike the 1975 (second) edition, this third edition was to undergo a thorough and new translation from Latin into all the vernacular languages. For ten years now Rome has used this third edition of the Roman Missal, while English-speaking Catholic has awaited a new translation to be received. This new translation will be used beginning November 28, 2011. (to be continued...)
