The Easter Vigil (Sat) will begin at 8:00 pm (no Saturday 5 pm Mass is allowed).

## THE ROMAN MISSAL – Part 16

The communal recitation of the Lord's Prayer along with the Prayer for Peace and the Sign of Peace are the proximate actions of preparation for the clergy and laity to receive Holy Communion. As you most certainly are aware, the Sign of Peace was a well-established rite within the Eucharistic Celebration in the Early Church. What you may not be aware of, is that the placement of that ritual varied widely from place to place. During the Middle Ages as the Mass became more standard in its form and more formal and highly stylized, the ritual was placed immediately before the reception of Holy Communion by the priest-celebrant and his ministers. (Remember that regular and frequent reception of Holy Communion was rare among the laity until early in the 20<sup>th</sup> century.) Gradually the Sign of Peace was eliminated from all forms of the Mass except the Solemn High Mass – and then, it was only exchanged by the priest, deacon, subdeacon and ministers at the altar. Even the form of the ritual was very formal and stylized.

With the introduction of the New Roman Missal in 1970 the Sign of Peace was restored and has become commonplace as an exchange among the laity in the assembly as well as among the clergy and ministers at the altar. The placement immediately prior to the reception of Holy Communion has been retained because it is reminiscent of the instruction of Jesus in the Sermon of the Mount found in Matthew 6:25ff, "if you approach the altar with you gift and there remember that you neighbor has anything against you whatsoever, leave you gift at the altar, go and seek out your neighbor and reconcile with him, then return and offer your gift."

Might I suggest for your reflection that in this ritual the laity bear on their shoulders an awesome responsibility for each other. If we were to take this instruction of Jesus seriously – even literally, we would be obliged to make peace with our neighbor. At the Sign of Peace not only are we afforded the opportunity to make peace with those we have offended or who have offended us; but we also "stand in place" of those who need reconciliation from a person who is not here present at that particular Eucharist. In my estimation this is a moments when we are most "Church-the People of God" for one another. It parallels the dual responsibility of the priest in the Sacrament of Penance who receives the contrition and repentance of a sinner and imparts both God's absolution and remission of sin and the forgiveness of the one who the sinner has wronged (or of the whole Christian community).

The ritual is intended to be simple, not intrusive or in any way a distraction from the Eucharistic Presence on the altar. Nor should it disrupt the flow of the Order of Mass. It ought to be relatively brief, and encompass just those who are immediately adjacent to us in the assembly. The priest, deacon and ministers also (except on rare occasion) extend the sign only to those nearest to them.

The words of the ritual will not change especially since the greeting "Peace be with you" is intended to echo the words of the Risen Jesus to his apostles. Typically we respond in a less formal and stylized manner by courteously accepting and returning the greeting to others.

You are most welcome to take extra Palm branches with you today as you leave Mass. Schedule reminders for Holy Week: Morning Masses on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday are at 7 am & 8 am and Tuesday evening at 7 pm. Stations of the Cross are Wednesday at 7 pm – followed by Confessions until all are heard, and Good Friday at 2:30 pm. Morning Prayer will be celebrated on Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 8 am; there are no morning Masses on these days. The Mass of Chrism is celebrated at the Cathedral Basilica on Thursday at 10 am (all are welcomed). The Mass of the Lord's Supper begins at 7:30 pm Thursday evening. The Liturgy of Good Friday of the Lord's Passion is 7:30 pm on Friday evening and the Easter Vigil will begin at 8 pm on Saturday evening (you are reminded that there is no 5 pm Mass that day). The Masses for Easter Sunday are at 7 am, 9 am and 11 am. There is no 5:15 pm Mass on Easter Sunday evening. The Liturgies of the Paschal Triduum are the most solemn and most significant liturgical celebrations of the entire year. I would very much like to encourage you to take the time to join us for these celebrations.

I am happy to announce that this year at the Easter Vigil we will celebrate Christian Initiation with the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist for Andrew Lopez and Matthew Lopez. Additionally, we will receive into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church Robert Soulon and Laura Ventura and complete their Christian Initiation with the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. Please remember them this week in your prayers.
